*October 21 – 30, 2017*

Dear NECA Members,

NECA sponsors International Study Missions to encourage the interchange of ideas, technologies and best practices among contractors in the U.S. and internationally. These specialized annual trips bring U.S. contractors into direct contact with owners, top management and the workforces of contracting firms in other countries.

This year's Study Mission travels to Tanzania with optional extensions to the Masai Mara, Kenya and Uganda. This tour will be an excellent opportunity to better understand how these African nations are finding their way into the world economy. And, through meetings with local contractors and visits to active construction projects in each area visited, you will see first-hand how our business is conducted.

Despite the many different cultures, Tanzania has had a peaceful history and enviable political stability compared to some of its neighboring countries; its people are friendly and welcoming. Combined, Ngorongoro Crater, the Serengeti and the Masai Mara, represent one of the world's most important ecosystems, some 3 million large animals inhabit this region. The annual wildebeest migration, the largest movement of animals on Earth, takes place on these East African plains. And, no area is more protected by geography and by permit than steep-walled Ngorongoro Crater, which has a separate ecosystem and its own collection of animals including lion, hyena, cheetah, leopard and elephant plus there's a good chance to see the very rare black rhino. Upon flying into Kilimanjaro International Airport, we'll see the tallest mountain in Africa and the highest walkable mountain in the world.

Our accommodations are luxury safari lodges and tents. Each property is individually designed and operated around the philosophy of "luxury, naturally". Since we're effectively booking most of the accommodations in each camp, they are requiring a significant advance deposit now. So, if indeed you're intending to come, please return the Reservation Form right away or give a call to re-affirm. The package prices include the intra-Africa airfares; so all we need worry about is the international air to/from. We're all arriving into Kilimanjaro; departure cities will vary and are specified in the itineraries.

**October 22, Sunday**                      **Arrive Kilimanjaro International Airport**                      **D**

Our driver/guide will meet us upon arrival from where we're driven to Kilimamoja Lodge, our home for the next 3 nights. A newly built luxury lodge Kilimamoja is located in small & wildlife-packed Lake Manyara National Park. We'll be nestled on the rim of the Great African Rift Valley, the views over Lake Manyara, Mount Meru and, on a clear day, Mount Kilimanjaro are stunning.

Afterward, browse stalls filled with locally grown produce on a market visit. Then, depart for Ngorongoro Crater, stopping at Gibb's Farm for an organic lunch. Afterward, relax on the lush grounds or hike to the nearby waterfalls. Continue to our lodge, which offers breath-taking views of the Ngorongoro Highlands.

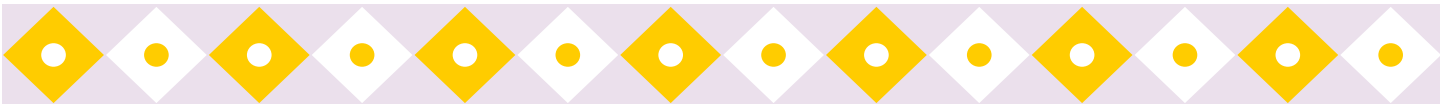
**October 27, Friday**                      **Ngorongoro Crater to Serengeti National Park**                      **BLD**

Morning and afternoon game drives in the arid, savagely beautiful Serengeti plains. Good chances of spotting hippos returning to water after foraging for food overnight, elephants rustling through trees in search of breakfast, and sated lions, arriving back from a hunt. This afternoon, we search for elusive cheetahs, crocodiles and the stunningly beautiful leopard. Later, visit a Masai village, to meet with an elder and learn about the tribe's traditional, nomadic lifestyle and coexistence with wildlife. Also, partake in an artisan visit, when the villagers share a beadwork demonstration. Return to camp for a special farewell dinner in the bush.

If you have a day-time flight to the US, you'll transfer to the nearest airstrip (30-minute drive) for your scheduled flight to Kilimanjaro. Those flying at night will be driven to Arusha and the Mount Meru Hotel for lunch and use of a day room to freshen up. Later you will be transferred to Kilimanjaro Airport for your outbound flight.

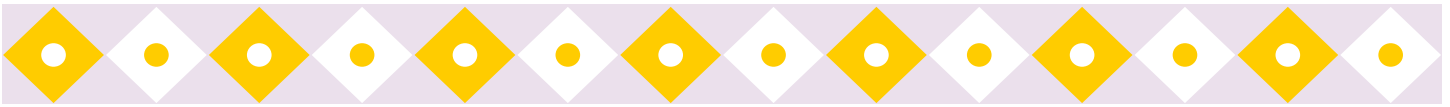

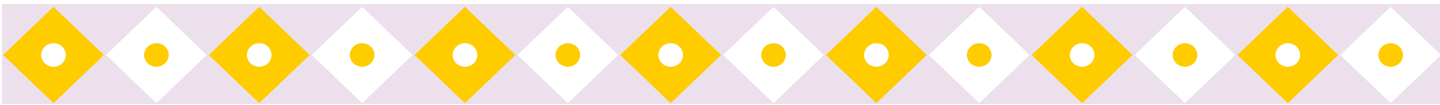

**Reservations and Payment:** Reservations are confirmed by American Travel Association (ATA), upon receipt of the Reservation Form and deposit. Reservations require a **non-refundable \$1,200** per person deposit to accompany the Coupon. To insure your place, receipt of deposit is due in the office of ATA no later than February 24, 2017. Final payment is due by August 14th. All payments must be made by check payable to American Travel Association or by Visa, MasterCard, Discover Card or American Express.

**Cancellation:**

**Land Package:** Penalty on cancellations received between August 15th and departure will be 100% of the tour price depending upon the amount recoverable from the suppliers to whom payment had been sent. Cancellation penalties are required to offset non-refundable hotel and supplier payments made by ATA in advance of the tour. There will be no refunds once the tour has begun. *Cancellations* must be made in writing to ATA. To avoid discrepancies, ATA will not act on information given over the phone until written notice has been received.

**Weather:** Tanzania is on the same latitude as Quito Ecuador. We can expect similar early spring weather, which should be rather comfortable. The average high temperature in Nairobi is 73, the low 53 and 7 days of the month average some rain. More weather/clothing detail will come in the final advice memo.

**Health:** The Participants represent that neither he nor she nor anyone traveling with him or her has any physical or other condition or disability that could create a hazard to him or herself or other members of the tour. This program involves walking over uneven surfaces and climbing stairs at locations that are not handicap accessible. A letter of explanation of any physical or mental condition which may require medical attention or special equipment (wheelchair, for example) must be enclosed with the Reservation Form.

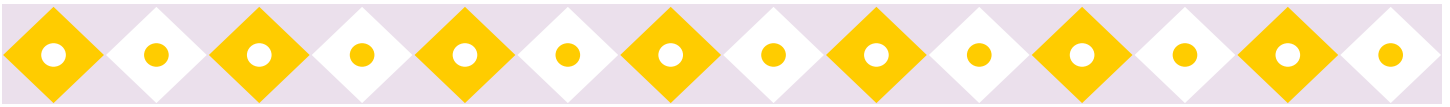
**Vaccinations** – Yellow Fever vaccination is required for Kenya and Uganda, not Tanzania. You **must bring** the original yellow vaccination card. The yellow fever vaccination lasts a long time; however, if yours was long ago, you might consult with your Dr. about a booster shot. While there's a low risk of **malaria**, we strongly recommend taking a preventative medication.

**Airline Contract:** The usual passage contract when the ticket is issued shall constitute the sole contract between the airline and the tour participant. Neither NECA or ATA shall be liable for airline cancellation penalties incurred by purchasing non-refundable tickets.

**Trip cancellation insurance**—Particularly since this tour involves non-refundable payments, we strongly encourage obtaining trip cancellation insurance. Contact Allianz [www.allianztravelinsurance.com](http://www.allianztravelinsurance.com) either on-line or over the phone (800-284-8300). The airlines also have good insurance options. Trip cancellation insurance is a good idea because it offsets non-refundable air, hotel, and operator charges. Please note the Pre-Existing Conditions Exclusion in the Medical Conditions section. If one exists, you need to purchase the insurance within 14 days of your first payment. Allianz has a number of plans. For most, the Basic Plan is fine. However, everyone has different needs, which you should discuss with them. Also check with your insurance agent to see what is covered under your existing homeowners and medical policies. For example, suitcases and contents are probably covered under your homeowner's.

**Prices:** The tour price is subject to change due to land cost increases and foreign exchange fluctuation. ATA reserves the right to change the price for such reasons or changes in the number of participants (26) upon which the tour costs are based. All prices are based on rates and tariffs in effect on January 27, 2017.





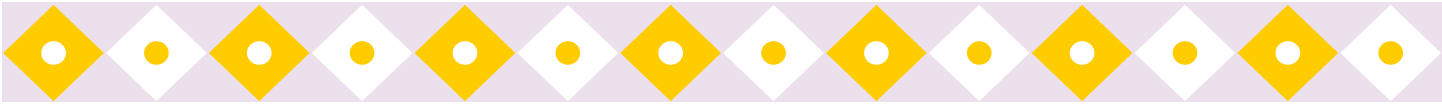

The Participants' retention of air tickets, reservations or bookings after issuance shall constitute consent to the above terms and conditions. If, due to weather, flight schedules or other uncontrollable factors, you are required to spend additional nights before or after the tour, participants will be responsible for your own hotel, transfers, meals and related costs. Baggage and personal effects are the sole responsibility of the owners at all times. ATA and NECA reserve the right to cancel any itinerary or any part thereof and to make such alterations in the itinerary they deem necessary or desirable.

**Travel Advisories/Warnings:** No State Department travel warning currently exist for Tanzania. Yes, for Uganda and Kenya. ATA will send those reports. However, it's the responsibility of the Participant to become informed about the most current travel advisories and warnings by referring to the U. S. State Department's travel website at [www.travel.state.gov](http://www.travel.state.gov) or by phone at 1-888-407- 4747. In the event of an active State Department Travel Warning or alert against travel to any of the specific destinations included in the tour, should the Participant still choose to travel, notwithstanding any travel advisory or warning, the Participant assumes all risk of personal injury, death or property damage that arise out of the events like those advised or warned against. The State Department's travel information will be sent by American Travel with the welcome letter. American Travel will monitor the State Department advisories.

**Proof of Citizenship and Visa Requirements:** A valid passport is required for travel that must be valid 6 months beyond the ending trip date. Plus, you need at least 3 blank pages. Please check to be sure your passport isn't about to expire. Visas are necessary for American citizens traveling to Tanzania, Kenya & Uganda. Upon arriving Killmanjaro, you will be met by a local guide who will assist in getting your visa. For those extending to Kenya or Uganda, you will be met and assisted in obtaining a visa good for both countries.

**Tax Deductibility:** Current U.S. tax regulations allow deductibility for travel and subsistence expenses incurred in travel related to trade or business. It is the responsibility of the traveller to become familiar with and adhere to the specific reporting requirements imposed.
