Colonial Williamsburg is a living village with hundreds of restored, reconstructed and historically furnished buildings.where costumed interpreters tell the stories of the men and women of this 18th-century city. Since you are so close at the DC Convention, please join us to explore colonial American history on a tour planned especially for NECA members. The tour begins Wednesday morning, October 16, and returns to Washington's Reagan and Dulles airports Friday, October 18, in time for afternoon flights home. Our accommodations are at the historic 5-Star Williamsburg Inn.



Oct. 16, Wednesday, Washington/Colonial Williamsburg

- **L 8:30-9:00am** Pick-up from the two hotels where the majority of the group will be staying. Depending on stops enroute, our drive to Williamsburg takes only two and a half to three hours.
 - Our first stop on arrival is lunch at <u>Shield's Tavern</u>, featuring a colonial-inspired menu of southern comfort food, ale, and entertainment.

1:30pm Depart on a guided walking tour of **Colonial Williamsburg**. The historic area features preserved and restored buildings from the era when Williamsburg was the capital of Virginia and gathering

place for leaders of the American Revolution. Our guide will detail a first-hand look at life in colonial 18th century America. You can then re-visit the sites that interest you most. Everyone will have a "Value Pass" that grants entrance into the buildings in the historic area for our entire stay.


- grants entrance into the buildings in the historic area for our entire stay. The evening is open to stroll the historic streets and have dinner at the Inn or one of the taverns.

Oct. 17, Thursday Colonial Williamsburg & Jamestown



D 9:00am Departure for Jamestown Settlement (20-minute ride), which is an outdoor living-history experience that re-creates the first permanent English colony in the New World. Our guided tour visits exhibition galleries where we learn about Jamestown and it's people — Powhatan, Pocahontas and John Rolfe (who were married here) and Captain John Smith. You will see the three ships that arrived in 1607 — the Sussex Constant, Godspeed and Discovery. Thereafter, we have time to explore and enjoy a cafe lunch.



1:30pm Enroute back to the Williamsburg Inn, we stop at the <u>Williamsburg Pottery Factory</u>, where you will have time for early Christmas shopping. Non-shoppers will be taken back to Williamsburg.

- Reservations are suggested if you want to have "Royal Tea" at the Inn.
- Upon returning, be sure to revisit the <u>Capitol Building</u> to learn about the colony's contributions to the American Revolution. At the <u>Governor's Palace</u>, you'll experience the grandeur of royal government in Virginia just before the collapse. <u>R.Charleston's Coffeehouse</u> offers a glimpse into the then fashionable world of the coffeehouses. At <u>Anderson's Blacksmith Shop & Public Armory</u>, you'll see blacksmiths and armorers hard at work.

6:30pm Dinner tonight at <u>King's Arms Tavern</u>.

Oct. 18, Friday Williamsburg/Washington/Home

8:00am The coach will return to Washington dropping those departing from Reagan National Airport by 11:30am (for flights leaving at 12:30 and later) and those departing from Dulles Airport by 1pm (for flights leaving at 2pm and later). Those departing from BWI can catch a shuttle from Reagan (allow 2 hours).

CONDITIONS

Reservations and Payment: Reservations will be confirmed by American Travel Association (ATA) upon receipt of the Reservation Coupon and \$150 per person deposit. Receipt of final payment is due in the office of ATA no later than August 20. All payments must be made by check payable to American Travel Association or by MasterCard, Visa or American Express card.

Cancellation: Cancellations must be made in writing to ATA. To avoid discrepancies, ATA will not act on information given over the phone until written notice has been received.

Land Package: A \$100 per person cancellation fee will be charged regardless of the reason. Penalty on cancellations received between August 20 and departure will be a maximum of 100% of the land cost per person, depending upon the amount recoverable from the suppliers to whom payment had been sent. Cancellation penalties are required to offset non-refundable hotel and supplier payments made by ATA in advance of the tour. There will be no refund for unused services once the tour has begun.

Insurance: Trip cancellation, baggage and medical insurance coverage is available for purchase through a form to be sent by ATA. We strongly recommend insurance coverage. When last-minute illnesses occur, the insurance helps offset non-refundable air and land charges.
